## Cutting Templates

## 6" x 9" Paper: Set 1

On the next page are four cutting templates showing how to cut $6 " \times 9^{\prime \prime}$ paper and leave no scraps. You can put the pieces together multiple ways; I have card sketches on my site that show one way to put the pieces together.

The card sketches are for a mix of mini slimline and standard A2 cards. Standard A2 size is $4.25^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5^{\prime \prime}$ (card base: $8.5^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5$, score at $4.25^{\prime \prime}$ or $4.25^{\prime \prime}$ x $11^{\prime \prime}$, score at $5.5^{\prime \prime}$ ). Mini slimline size varies, but I prefer $3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ (card base $7^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$, score at $3.5^{\prime \prime}$ ). I usually have a card front that is $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ smaller than the card base on all sides.

I like to mat my patterned paper on cardstock before attaching it to the card front. I prefer $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cardstock mats, but occasionally use $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ cardstock mats. You will likely have cardstock pieces leftover if you mat the patterned paper. Colored cardstock scraps are great for small die cuts and sentiments. White cardstock scraps are nice for cutting multiple of the same die then layering to add extra dimension.
